Joining him in performance are bassist, David Rosin, and pianist-vocalist, Robin Connell, the host of the concert series [produced by the music committee]. Among other performances, Rosin is bassist for symphony orchestras and at the Wharton Center

for theatrical shows. Connell's career is equally divided between performing and teaching, she is the recipient of several music grants, awards and fellowships, and has performed all over the USA.

Fountain Street works in partnership with other houses of worship and charitable organizations to serve the poor, stand up for the oppressed, and create a world of "liberty and justice for all." Dave is currently the music director for the Rogues as well as the leader of The River City Jazz Ensemble, The Northview Community Band, The Dave Wells Strolling German Oompa Band, and The Ein Prosit German Band. Besides being a freelance trombone performer, he is a published composer and arranger. Fair to say, Dave keeps very busy spreading the joy of jazz.

Jim Everhart (piano) has played his piano in local and regional venues for over 45 years. In his early days Jim played organ and keyboard for several rock and roll bands, including the Ramrods. His interest expanded to traditional dance bands, then jazz and novelty offshoots like sing-a-long

Tommy Davis (drums) has played all over U.S.A. and performed at the Montreux Jazz Festival in Switzerland, Brussels, Belgium, and London, England. He was also part of a musical foreign exchange between the United States and the Soviet Union back in 1979. Tom credits his musical skills to the diversity of talented musicians he has been able to perform with.

David Schock (brass) has played with the Bruce Early Big Band, the Truth in Jazz Orchestra, and his own group, Schock Effect. Both a writer and filmmaker, he has published both. David holds a bachelor's degree in religion, a master's in journalism, and a doctorate in creative writing and literary criticism as well as post-doctoral studies in telecommunication at Michigan State University. He taught for 20 years at Central Michigan University and Hope College. Dave currently plays trumpet, cornet, and flugelhorn with the River Rogues.

In the 1980's he was the music director for Holiday on Ice while on tour. Since 2009, he has been a highly sought after music film score creator for Hollywood and Salt Lake City film studios. He currently is the director of bands and low brass instructor at Cornerstone University and director of the Grand Band from the St Cecilia Society.

Ken Huisman (clarinet) has been a professional musician since 1963. After a two-year stint with the 79th Army Band in Panama, he performed a solid schedule of club dates, including big band venues,

RAGS TO RICHES - A TRIBUTE TO TONY BENNETT, 11/21/2016



Our host for the evening was GR's our own heart throb, vocalist Rick Reuther. Tom Hagen was on keyboard, Cherie Lynn, drums and vocals, Mike Lutley on saxes and flute, Elgin Vines on bass, and Kevin Jones on percussion. The men were dressed in black tuxedos and Cherie wore an elegant long dress. WMJS audio genius, Kurt Ehinger, never left his post. His expertise assured the show would be in perfect balance.

Rick gave a little history of Tony Bennett's life throughout the evening. One of Tony's great mentors was Pearl Bailey, and his 'big jazz years' were full of great singers and musicians. Rick's first song was "The Good Life", followed by "The Shadow of Your Smile". Tony's first big hit was "Because of You", and Rick sang it with passion. Another of Tony's hits was "Joanna", and later, he named his daughter Joanna, in honor of that song.

Some high lights from first set included a guitar instrumental by Tom, accompanied by the man with the golden sax, Mike Lutley.

When Rick sang "This Time" it brought out the swing dancers. Mary Rademacher Reed, our own jazz and dance gueen, then joined Rick in a duet, "Stepping Out". Mike's solo in "When I Fall in Love" was so amazing you could have heard a pin drop.

The second set began with a sexy saxophone solo by Mike and the band performed "For Once in My Life", a tremendous rendition that had everyone's toes tapping. Rick set up his next tune by taking a deep breath, then hesitated between each word, "If - I---ruled----the -----world". A song Rick sang with such heart felt sentiment, I had a hard time not tearing up.

Barb Keller, loyal past board member and the sponsor for this Gumbo, was celebrating her birthday. The band played "Happy Birthday" and every one sang. Joe Morello sat in on the drums while Cherie jazzed up singing "Put on a Happy Face". We should dub her our "UPTOWN GIRL" as she is always happy and loves entertaining. Rick gave us bit of trivia explaining that it was Hank Williams who talked Tony Bennett into trying a little "pop", hence the tune, "Cold Cold Heart", a cross between country and straight ahead jazz. The evening ended with Rick belting out one of Tony's favorites "Rags to Riches", then his signature song "I Left My Heart In San Francisco". This brought the audience to their feet with whistles, applause, and a cry for more.

Rick, thank you for your "Tribute to Tony Bennett", it was sensational. Thanks to the band and to Mary Rad for her guest appearance. And, Tony Bennett, thank you too for singing such wonderfully written songs. You truly are one of the GREATS and will go down in history as such.

Libby York and company - October 17, 2016



Welcome. That's what vocalist, Libby York, made us feel during her October jazz gumbo concert. Her vocal delivery was as pleasant as was her relaxed charm on the bandstand. Based in Chicago, IL during the summer months and Key West, FL in winters, York surrounded herself, as

usual, with respected, seasoned & talented Michigan musicians. Terry Lower on piano, Ed Fedewa on bass, Jim Hayward on horns and flute and Larry Ochiltree on drums were solid, creative and complimented Libby's easy, polished style.

From the openers, a swinging You Make Me Feel So Young and bossa, Autumn Leaves, reflecting the season and her love of Paris, where she also performs, sung beautifully in French; Libby and the group took the large and very attentive crowd down memory lane. A big highlight and thoughtful touch was the addition of original and clever lyrics to Let's Get Away From It All, penned by York, reflecting her affection for Grand Rapids. "Let's take a trip up to Michigan, north from Chicago

we'll go. Pine trees and blue lakes, whitefish & snowflakes, jazz in Grand Rapids, you know. The Calder sculpture's a beauty, ArtPrize & crowds at the GRAM. The river is rushin', not that I'm gushin', But GR is a Grand Slam!"

The group mixed it up: Ellington, Porter, Kern, Mercer and more. Terry Lower's Caravan was a real showstopper, as well as sax man, Jim Hayward's feature - an Ellington gutsy blues that he wailed on! Each musician showed what professionalism and experience sounds like. York expertly tucked in a couple of more obscure standards - a bluesy Still on the Road, and Abbey Lincoln's Throw It Away, which included an intro about the cherished opportunity she had to work with the great Lincoln.

All in all, a lovely and enjoyable night of music; thanks for the memories and keeping us "Young at Heart", Libby. We "Love Being here with You", too!
