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Trombonist Terry Kimura studied at the University of Michigan with H. Dennis Smith, David Jackson, and Donald Walden, earning a B.F.A. in Jazz Studies and M.A. in Improvisation. He has become a regular member of the Paul Keller Orchestra, Rampage Swing, Third Coast Kings, Rhythm Society Orchestra, Easy Street Jazz Band, and many other groups in Southeastern Michigan.

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On February 27 at 7:00 PM, the Progressions Jazz Series will feature the BEER CITY SAXES: Woody Herman and the "Four Brothers" style.

The Beer City Saxes draws its members from the Grand Rapids Jazz Orchestra. Venues they have performed at include Harmony Hall, the B.O.B. and at Waldron Public House in Grand Rapids. They have also performed at the Grand Rapids Festival of the Arts, the Lansing Jazz Festival, and for the Thornapple Jazz Festival in Hastings. Due to the Beer City Saxes' popularity with musicians, saxophonists often rotate throughout a performance, featuring anywhere from 4 to 7 saxophones with jazz rhythm section. This performance will feature James Hayward, Greg Marsden, and Tom Stansell on tenor Saxophones, and Gary McCourry on baritone saxophone. The rhythm section will include pianist Steve Talaga, drummer Eddie Eicher and bassist Dave Collee.

For this performance, The Beer City Saxes will specialize in the "Four Brothers" style, a term derived from the 1947 hit that featured the Woody Herman saxophone section in an instrumentation of 3 tenor saxes and a baritone sax.

Jay Mitzner began the Bayou River Band and hired Shannon Wade on bass. Detroit native Wade attended Vanderbilt University. He is a member of RJ Spangler's Planet D Nonet which was awarded the 2016 Detroit Music award's Outstanding Traditional Jazz Artist/Group. MONDAY NIGHT JAZZ AT THE KNICKERBOCKER!

March 19th will we welcome the Fred Knapp Trio featuring Dave Proulx, piano and vocals. This trio is reminiscent of the great trios of the past like the Oscar Peterson, Bill



Evans, and Ahmad Jamal; along with the fresh sounds of trios of today like the Brad Mehldau and the Benny Green. Their repertoire consists of new arrangements of song book standards and originals from each member of the group. The trio captivates with their high level of group interaction and dynamics. They have released sixty

They have released eight CD's starting with "Happy Jazz", (2005) "Music of Gershwin, Songbook Series Vol. 1, (2007) "Music of Cole Porter, Songbook Series Vol. 2," (2008) "More Happy Jazz", (2009) "Standards and More, Vol 1." 2011) "How Deep Is The Ocean" (2014), and "Song for Jaden" (2015).



Fred Knapp is a drummer, pianist composer and educator who studied music at Western Michigan University. He has been a Grand Rapids jazz staple drummer for many years with his special touch on drum set and ability to adapt to any playing situation. He has studied with Quincy Davis, Keith Hall, Tim Froncek, and Rupert Kettle. He also studied jazz piano with Dr. Steve Zegree and drum set with legendary jazz drummer Billy Hart, while getting a music degree from Western Michigan University. Since graduation from WMU in 2003, Fred has been busy performing in the Midwest with his trio and working as a freelance musician. Fred also has a thriving teaching studio where he teaches piano and drum set.



Multi-talented **Dave Proulx** is the pianist and vocalist for the trio and is also a pastor. Dave received a degree in Piano Performance and jazz studies from Western Michigan University. The last four years Dave attended the Dallas Theological Seminary where he received his master's degree in theology. We are pleased Dave has returned to Michigan where he is currently the pastor of the Battle Creek Community Church.

In addition to being a great bass player, **David Rosin** is a very active music educator. He holds a BA and a MA in Music education from Michigan State University. He has taught both middle and high school orchestras in East Lansing for 10 years. David works across Michigan as a guest clinician and judge for the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association (MSBOA). He is currently serving as VP of Orchestra Activities for MSBOA. In 2015 he was selected as MSBOA orchestra teacher of the year. David has also served as conductor for the Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp and the Michigan Chapter of the American String Teachers Association Camp.

April 16th we will welcome **JMM Jazz** band to our stage for the first time. JMM Jazz is vintage era vocal jazz at its finest, smooth and classy. JMM Jazz can range from a trio to as many as ten members. For our Gumbo evening they will be a quartet, featuring vocalists Diego and Diana Vandewater with Chris Corey on piano and Tom Taylor on drums.

On March 27, Peaches and the Progression Series will present Flamenxico!

The Progressions Jazz Series is proud to introduce Camilo Nu and Laura Mateo for the February installment of WMJS's new music series. The only thing that can make flamenco guitar sound any more beautiful is to add a lovely Spanish singer to the mix.

"Flamenxico" is a concept that guitarist and producer Camilo Nu has been formulating for years. His idea was to form a link between flamenco and Mexican music. This concept began to take shape after Camilo began the filming of his documentary film "The Third Root". Now, with Spanish singer Laura Mateo it has become a reality for him to complete this formula.

Their repertoire is based on popular Mexican songs in flamenco genres.

"Our performances sound like flamenco but with the Mexican touch." Camilo Nu's guitar playing is what he calls the new generation of flamenco toque that is impregnated with jazz and contemporary harmony.

Laura's singing also corresponds to a very modern way of singing flamenco, but with an echo that reminds us of the great singers of the past.

A multi-instumentalist, Camilo's passion for flamenco began when he discovered a record by Paco de Lucia in his home library. That sound captures him and keeps him being faithful to the flamenco guitar. He doesn't define himself as a jazz musician or as a flamenco guitarist, but rather as an 'expresser'.

This project has already been presented in Spain in the flamenco circuits and is getting good reviews.

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Ah, Michigan, so much talent!

WMJS's past president James Akins has good reason to be proud of his son's successful musical career. Keaton Damir Akins was a former WMJS scholarship winner, twice! A gifted trumpet player, Keaton has performed with the Eastern Musical Festival Orchestra of North Carolina, Western Michigan University Jazz Orchestra, his alma mater, and the Henry Mancini Institute Orchestra. Most recently Keaton was selected by Rodney Whitaker to join the prestigious Dr. Phillips Center Jazz Orchestra. Akin's response to the audition? "I had to give it a try.... His (Whitaker's) involvement alone underscored the seriousness of this project."

Detroit native bassist Whitaker is considered one of the leading performers and teachers of double bass in the United States of America. He is an internationally renowned musician and a Mack Avenue recording artist on over 100 recordings. Whitaker currently holds the titles of Professor of Jazz bass and Director of Jazz Studies at Michigan State University where he has built one of the leading jazz degree programs and performing faculty in the U.S.

ArtsLife Magazine's fall 2017 issue featured an article "Proud and Pitch Perfect" written by Darrel E. Owens about the creation of the Dr. Phillips Center Jazz Orchestra and their June performance of "Ellington for Lovers". He stated that Whitaker "wanted an orchestra that could both entertain and educate, one that filled hearts with exquisite music and minds with knowledge about this singularly American art form. To that end he wielded a rigid yardstick when measuring candidates".

The cover portrait on Keaton's latest CD is from the collection of artist and Professor Jon McDonald of Grand Rapids who granted exclusive rights to Keaton to use the painting, and McDonald gave Keaton the original painting as a token of his admiration. The CD, "The Thus Come One's Secret" was recorded 2016 in Orlando. Keaton performs all the tracks and plays all the instruments.

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

Sunday, February 25th at 4 p.m. Adventure Music will celebrate Max Colley III's new recording "Jubilee". The concert will include Max on trumpet, MSU's Diego Rivera on saxophones, Luther Allison at the piano, Liany Mateo on bass and WMU's Keith Hall playing drums.

"2017 marked the 100 year anniversary of Dizzy Gillespie's birth, and social media was frowning over a perceived lack of Gillespie's influence in today's music. Wait a minute! On this new album "Jubilee" Max Colley III plays Dizzy's composition "Tour De Force" with Gillespie's principle protégé, now master musician in his own right, Jon Faddis. The legacy of Dizzy, Louis Armstrong, Duke Ellington, in fact the entire history of jazz, is addressed on "Jubilee." which features over 33 musicians ranging in age from 20 to 87 years old! Adventuremusic.org is proud to introduce Max's most ambitious recording project to date, a set including quest appearances by the last surviving member of Miles Davis's "Kind of Blue" sextet, drummer Jimmy Cobb, as well as an array of local and "Big Apple" musicians." A native of Grand Rapids, son of all-star music educator Max Colley Jr., Max Colley III was a member of the 1987 McDonalds All-American Band and Jazz Band. Max was WMJS's Musician of the Year 2014, and has performed for 3 USA presidents. Today he is the Jazz Events Coordinator at Michigan State University.

Sunday, March 25th at 3 p.m. a very special appearance celebrating guitarist Gene Bertoncini's 80th Birthday during his 25th year collaborating with WMU faculty member, bassist Tom Knific. The duo will be joined by the virtuosic vocalist Sunny Wilkinson who just released the album "Into the Light" featuring songs by James Taylor, Chick Corea, Stephen Soundheim, Bobbie Gentry, Antonio Carlos Jobim and Joni Mitchell.





In January the University of Notre Dame Alumni Association recognized Gene Bertonicini's outstanding accomplishments with the prestigious Rev. Arthur S. Harvey C.S.C. Award. The New York native graduated from Notre Dame in 1959 with a degree in architecture then went on to become one of the world's preeminent jazz guitarists. Notre Dame writes, "His technique and lyricism have won him international praise and accolades as the 'Segovia of jazz.' An eloquent and versatile improviser. Bertoncini has been heard with an extraordinary range of jazz greats, including Benny Goodman, Buddy Rich, Wayne Shorter, Hubert Laws, and Paul Desmond, among others, as well as such distinguished singers Tony Bennett, Lena Horne, Nancy Wilson, Vic Damone and Eydie Gorme.

"A prolific and popular studio musician, Bertoncini honed his professional chops as a member of the Tonight Show band during Johnny Carson's tenure, and he has worked with composers and arrangers such as Lalo Schifrin and Michel Legrand and has performed with the Metropolitan Opera Orchestra. In addition to an active performing and recording schedule, Bertoncini teaches at the Eastman School of Music and Williams Patterson University."

"It seems only beautiful sounds emanate from Gene Bertoncini's guitar," wrote New Yorker.

The Bridge Street Band led by Walt Gutowski on guitar brought together both old and new artists for our enjoyment. We had JR Simmons on keyboard, Charlie Hoats on fretless 6 string bass, Mark Weymouth on drums, John Gist on all three saxes which he played equally well. Paul Keen leant his considerable experience and history on trombone, Arnoldo Acevedo sat in on trumpet and the ever joyful Kevin Jones popped on percussion. Michelle Covington serenaded us with "Smooth Operator". Newer artists were vocalists Jess Slaydon and Tory Dale who brought a wealth of experience at a young age to share an original "In a Dream".

The second set was no less entertaining kicking off with "Kevin" by Pat Metheny. Michelle Covington followed with a flawless rendition of "Nearness of You" with an equally flawless breakout by John Gist.

We granted our host Walt the license to dedicate a blues song to his wife Amy Sue. After Walt danced on the tables with some great rock and roll Paul Keen brought us in for a smooth landing with a tour de force of "Misty". With the date in mind Jess Slaydon took a second to honor a courageous man in history Martin Luther King before she pranced through a Jackson 5 number. Michelle Covington closed out this great evening with an evocative rendition of "Look of Love".


