Pamela Wise, a native of Ohio, established the Ohio Movement, an R&B group that performed throughout the Midwest and East Coast. After 8 years with the Ohio Movement, Pamela followed her dream to be a jazz composer and pianist furthering her studies at Cuyahoga Community College. Pamela met Wendell Harrison (her future husband) in a recording studio and later he featured her compositions on his recordings, as well as featured her in his ensembles. Pamela has performed with and composed for legendary artists such as Freddie Hubbard, Woody Shaw, Leon Thomas, and Eddie Harris. Wendell Harrison introduced Pamela to world renowned percussionist Jerry Gonzalez and produced her first CD Songo Festividad. You can also find her most recent works: A New Message from the Tribe, Kindred Spirits, Negre Con Leche, and Pamela's Club. In 2016 Pamela was awarded the prestigious Kresge Creative Artist Fellowship Award for her work as a pianist, teacher, composer and cultural warrior. Pamela was also honored by the Kresge Foundation in 2019 for her production, Matrix X Detroit-The Gentrification Nation.







Wendell Harrison is co-founder of the legendary Tribe record label and collective. Together, the Harrisons founded Rebirth Inc., a non-profit jazz performance and education organization. Harrison is a Detroit native who attended school with the likes of trumpeter Lonnie Hillyer, saxophonist Charles McPherson and percussionist Roy Brooks, all of whom sparked his interest in jazz music. Like his classmates, Harrison began formal jazz studies with pianist Barry Harris. He also attended the Detroit Conservatory of Music, which is now known as the College for Creative Studies. Over the course of his career, Mr. Harrison has performed with Motown greats such as Marvin Gaye, Aretha Franklin and Sammy Ward, and world's premier jazz artists guitarist Grant Green, vocalist Eddie Jefferson and the great Sun Ra. Wendell Harrison is a living legend of jazz History and Black American music.
