#### **Letter from the President**

It is hard to believe that we are wrapping up another year! We had a fantastic year of music at our Jazz Gumbo concert series and the Jazz in the Park 10 week concert series. We were able to award scholarships to young people to attend the Aquinas College Jazz Camp and to attend college as well as having a band visit a school in our community. We also honored Kurt Ehinger with the first Betty Forrest Jazz Ambassador Award and Paul Smith as the Honorary Musician of the Year in Memoriam and held the banquet to celebrate with family and friends in attendance.

The West Michigan Jazz Society began in March 1986 with 20 founding members. Membership grew over time to a high of around 550. He has worked in many genres, including jazz, pop, theatre and more. His vocal 60's lounge group Blue Velvet was featured on America's Got Talent and he has revived the group here again in West MI.







## September 19th The Robin Connell Quartet

Welcome to Gumbo season, jazz fans. The season opened strong with The Robin Connell Quartet featuring on keys and vocals; performer, educator, and WMJS Musician of the Year Award winner, Robin Connell! Josiah DeNooyer on the drums; a recent WMU grad, Denis Shebukhov playing the double bass; a music educator and performer from Kalamazoo, and Yoseph Henry a grad student and educator at WMU, assisting with the vocal duties, rounded out the lineup.

Again, I am consistently amazed at how musicians, and in my opinion, jazz musicians in particular, can with little if any rehearsal create such wonderful auditory art and make it look easy. We'll, Dr. Connell and the band did that and told great stories and generally entertained us for far too short a time. With tunes such as "Days of Wine and Roses", "On a Clear Day", and others featuring Mr. Henry's liltingly powerful falsetto the audience was properly wowed, as was I. To finish a lovely night of music, Robin, Josiah, and Denis the played her "theme song", I'm Old Fashioned.

I would like to finish by saying that for the price, you will have a hard time finding a better value for dinner and a live show of this caliber. Tell your neighbors and friends. Do them, the Jazz Society, and live jazz music in our area a great favor.













### October 17th The Alain Sullivan Quartet



The Alain Sullivan Quartet graced the WMJS Stage for the second installment of Jazz Gumbo. Alain is a fairly recent U of M grad with dual majors in molecular biology and jazz studies sax/woodwinds, and has played in bands big and small all over this country and Denmark. He gathered an impressive group of musicians, starting with bass player Jon Webber, from

New York, who has played with more jazz heavy hitters than can be listed here. Sean Pearlmutter, originally from Grand Rapids coming from Detroit area and a Wayne State grad at the drums. Finally, on the keys, it's music educator, WMJS Musician of the Year Award winner, and local jazz legend Steve Talaga.

The band started out with Cedar Walton's Ugetsu, a sometimes dreamy bop tune featuring Mr. Talaga with a searing keys solo followed by an Ornette Coleman piece called "The Blessing". Debussy ounce said that "music is the silence between notes", Mr. Sullivan demonstrates this very well in this soulful rendition of "The Blessing" with particularly good drum accompaniment from Mr. Pearlmutter. Paul Dietrich's "Settle" is a musical journey that builds to a climax then onto a beautiful denouement played with impressive interplay between Webber and Talaga and a mesmerizing sax solo from Sullivan.

It was a night of amazing musicianship, a master class in bop jazz that won't be soon forgotten. Thanks to the Alain and the band and the West Michigan Jazz Society for providing another evening of superb jazz entertainment.

Remembering Bill Vits



**Bill Vits.** With heavy hearts, we share the sad news of the passing of another treasured member of our musical family – principal percussionist [for the Grand Rapids Symphony Orchestra], Bill Vits. While Bill's courageous two-year battle with cancer has come to an end, his spirit, verve and passion will live on in everyone who knew him. (Mary Tuuk Kuras, President & CEO)

'He made the world a better place.' Grand Rapids drummer Bill Vits had a huge impact on musicians, fans and students. His death has sparked loving memorials to this local icon. *(Local Spins)* Bill passed after a 2 year battle with cancer on Monday, October 17, 2022. He was 65.

There are several links for articles and memories (included below) with unending praise for his musical talents, as well as a well-loved human being. He brought joy and music everywhere he went - and he was "all over the place" *Ted Jauw*.



He filled childrens' gymnasiums with percussion, drum circles, the funky theremin and his



exuberant personality and smile. Bill sat in with bands -everywhere - jazz, afro-funk, rock, and more. His own group, The Concussions, were widely popular for their skeletal masks and heavy guitar/percussive and kooky stringbending music. He was funny and kind. He loved his brewed beer, his bike rides with fellow drummer, Randy Marsh, his kitties, his son, Tabor and his lovely wife, Stacey. He loved people. WMJS extends our deepest condolences.



Bill's last performance with the orchestra took place in September 2022 in the premiere of fellow Grand Rapids Symphony

musician Ale Miller's piece "Immortal Beloved". Cancer was ending his musical career, but he nonetheless performed with brilliance, sensitivity and light. (Mary Tuuk Kuras, President & CEO)

**Joey DeFrancesco**, who was widely credited with bringing the organ back into vogue in jazz circles in recent decades, died on August 25, 2022. He was 51.

DeFrancesco was an American jazz organist, trumpeter, saxophonist, and occasional singer. But he built his career playing an old-school B3. He released more than 30 albums under his own name, and recorded extensively as a sideman with such leading jazz performers as trumpeter Miles Davis, saxophonist Houston Person, and guitarist John McLaughlin.

Mr. DeFrancesco had musicianship in his genes: His father, John DeFrancesco, has been playing jazz organ since the 1950s. He was dazzling listeners when he was a teenager.

"DeFrancesco — whose infectious, imp-of-the-perverse expressions make him as much fun to watch as listen to — can stride, flatten fifths and string together quotes from Bird, Diz, Monk and Miles with the polished resourcefulness of the eight-year veteran that he is," Gene Seymour of The Philadelphia Daily News wrote in 1986 after observing the Settlement Jazz Ensemble at the Settlement Music School in Philadelphia, where the young Mr. DeFrancesco was then a student

**Margaret (Marg Ed) Kwapil** passed away in her sleep on August 15th, 2022, just two weeks shy of her 91st birthday.

Marg Ed was a WMJS member for many years and was an active, friendly person. Her late husband, Ray was a staunch jazz fan and his wake was called "Ray's Last Bash... And all that Jazz" in 2003, when he passed suddenly of a heart attack. Several local jazz musicians performed for the celebration at Fredrik Meijer Gardens.

Marg Ed's family held a similar, small scale event on Sunday, October 16,2022. We extend our sincere condolences to the family.



In Memorium



**Pharoah Sanders** (born Farrell Sanders; October 13, 1940 – September 24, 2022).

He was an American jazz saxophonist. Known for his overblowing, harmonic, and Qas multiphonic techniques on the saxophone, as well as his use of "sheets of sound", Sanders played a prominent role in the development of free jazz and spiritual jazz through his work as a member of John Coltrane's groups in the mid-1960s, and later through his solo work. He released over thirty albums as a leader and collaborated extensively with vocalist Leon Thomas and pianist Alice Coltrane, among many others. Fellow saxophonist Ornette Coleman once described him as "probably the best tenor player in the world".


