The first scholarship was set up in 1980 by one of West Michigan Jazz Society's founders, Betty Forrest, to honor her husband, Jimmy Forrest. She partnered with Grand Rapids Junior College (now known as GRCC) and after giving out 22 scholarships, those funds were exhausted.

Around 2009, Betty Forrest, John Miller and Jack Morrison put their heads together and set up what is now known as the West Michigan Jazz Society Scholarship Fund. The purpose of the Scholarship Fund is to financially assist deserving applicants in the pursuit of their musical education. The scholarships have been given to one to three students each year in amounts of \$1,000 and frequently \$2,000.

Monday Night Jazz



March 18

Van Goor has built a reputation for not only being an excellent vocalist, but a creative force to be reckoned with. Her hard work has yielded two EPs, first "When the Shadows Fall" in 2021 and the second being "Don't Be Mad At Me" in August of 2023. These recordings have taken her to tour in surrounding major cities such as Ann Arbor, Toledo, Cleveland, Columbus, Southbend, Chicago, and Pittsburgh. Additionally, she received "Best Vocalist" for the Preservation of Jazz Excellence Award in Detroit, nominations by the Detroit Music Awards and recognition by many Michigan-based publications. Beyond recording, she has produced the show "Duets" with vocalist/bassist Reuben Stump exploring the history of vocal jazz duets and some of her own arrangements as

well as an "Anita O'Day Tribute" in which she pays tribute to the legendary vocalist Anita O'Day. She has worked with musicians like Detroit pianist Scott Gwinnell, 2-time JUNO award winning vocalist Caity Gyorgy, and prolific Ann Arbor string bassist Paul Keller. Olivia continues to collaborate with many Michigan leaders in jazz in addition to surrounding midwest musicians to spread musical joy.

Cooper has performed with international jazz artists Frank Wess, Milt Hinton, Mark Levine, Marcus Belgrave, Ira Sullivan, Buddy de Franco, and Jon Faddis and the Chicago Jazz Ensemble. Originally from Chicago and moving to West Michigan in 1997, he has performed with many musicians from that state including clarinetist Dave Bennett, Jeff Haas, Terry Lower, Rob Smith, Bill and Laurie Sears, Jerry McKenzie, Tad Weed and Paul Keller to name a few.

He has appeared in many clubs, concerts and festivals including The Chicago Jazz Festival, Joe Segal's Jazz Showcase, Chicago's Green Mill, Baker's Keyboard Lounge and venues in Phoenix, San Francisco, Denver and Taiwan. As a Delmark recording artist in the early 90s, he released two CDs with jazz legend Ira Sullivan, Tough Town and Nutville. Jim's awards include a 1986 National Endowment for the Arts grant, a WYCE-FM "Jammie Award," and ArtPrize's 2015 "Best Jazz Composition Award" for his song, Third Circle.

As an educator, Jim has taught vibraphone for the Jazz Institute of Chicago and Northwestern University. Since 2001, he has taught summers at Blue Lake Fine Arts Camp and is currently, an adjunct music instructor at Lake Michigan College. He endorses Musser Vibes and Mike Balter Mallets.

Mary's coconspirators of cool were multi-instrumentalists Cherie Lynne (drums, guitar, and vocals), and birthday boy Tom Hagen (keys, clarinet, accordion, and vocals).

Mary and the band played two tight, entertaining sets featuring tunes by Irving Berlin (It's a Lovely Day Today), Burt Bacharach, Lambert, Hendricks & Ross, a gem by Anne Hampton Callaway (You Can't Rush Spring) seasoned with a generous sprinkling of Latin beats (This Happy Madness, Jobim). The space allotted to me this month limits my reporting, but what I witnessed were three musicians, and entertainers, keeping one hundred plus jazz fans completely engaged and amused (Hold That Tiger) in the best musical way possible. Humor, knowledge, and downright zaniness (Twisted) were delivered throughout the performance right down to the last tune, on which they were joined by MOY nominee Kevin Jones (perc.) and Mike Lutley (sax).

We look forward to seeing these great performers again soon.

CALL FOR POTENTIAL BOARD MEMBERS

The West Michigan Jazz Society will accept nominations for the board of directors until April1, 2024. Any member in good standing, age 21 or older, may have their name submitted. 1. Candidates are expected to complete and submit an application form by April 1. 2. Applications will be presented to the board in its April meeting, selection(s) will occur in May. 3. The term of office, on a board consisting of no more than 12 members, is for three years, beginning at the annual meeting of the society in June. All affairs of the society are managed and directed by the board, without any compensation for board duties greater than reimbursement for actual expenses. We are currently a 550-member organization operating within a \$65,000 annual budget.

Permanent standing committees of the WMJS:

- the jazz program committee recommends to the Board names of musicians and venues for our events throughout the year and facilitates the decisions made for these events.
- the treasury committee keeps financial records & pays bills. Also includes a fundraising committee to solicit contributions from individuals and organizations to support our various activities and functions.
- the marketing and communications committee develops and executes plans to inform the public about our events and programs via newspaper, radio, TV and social media outlets.
- the membership committee assumes a leadership role in securing new members, supervises in recording/managing all contact information and correspondence,
- and manages and reports funds received from members and donors.
- the scholarship committee raises and manages our scholarship funds, and recommends disbursements to deserving student applicants.

- the education committee creates and manages ways to promote the pursuit of jazz to area students.
- the nominating committee recruits reviews and presents nominees for the board's approval.

Board Member Duties and Obligations: WMJS will always need volunteers to help carry out our programs and initiatives. Board members are expected to have a larger perspective, and the planning and organizational skills to help lead the Jazz Society. Specifically, Board members are expected to:

- attend monthly meetings, currently held on the last Thursday of each month except December
- actively serve on at least one committee
- be well-informed of the Society¹s purpose, programs, and objectives
- share their particular expertise toward achieving objectives, and support decisions made by the majority of the Board.
- help establish and abide by the rules and regulations meant to manage and direct the business and other affairs of the Society.
- be available to promote, attend, and assist at the majority of Society events throughout the year.





Musician of the Year Nominees

Kevin Jones

Percussionist Kevin Jones, is a native of culturally fertile Englewood, New Jersey, Kevin grew up in a household immersed in jazz, soul, gospel and blues. He was drawn to music at the early age of 10 Before he was out of High School he was already touring and playing gigs. Living in Englewood he was surrounded by excellent musicians and recording artists. By the time he was 19 he was touring Europe and recording with Jazz great Archie Shepp. Just months later he would join the Isley Brothers where he toured and recorded on some of their most iconic albums. During that time he would also tour with Whitney Houston for over four years.

During his career Kevin recorded and toured with Jazz legends Reggie Workman, Hilton Ruiz, Grady Tate, Winard Harper and Charles McPherson. His touring also included Angela Winbush, Gloria Gaynor and Jazz great Benny Powell. Kevin can also be heard on recordings by House music legends Louie Vega, Kenny Dope, Kevin Hedge and Blaze and R&B legend Angie Stone. Since moving to Grand Rapids 8 years ago Kevin has worked with virtually every local artist in-cluding Robin Connell, Elgin Vines, Rick Reuther, The Hagens, Edye Evan-Hyde, GR Jazz Or-chestra, Third Coast Swing and many many more. He has served as clinician at the Aquinas Jazz Camp, Western Michigan University. Kevin also curates the music at GRNoir wine and Jazz and is currently is on faculty in the Jazz Studies and Percussion Areas at Michigan State University.



Rick Reuther

Rick grew up in Plymouth, MI and is a graduate of MSU. He has been delighting audiences with his singing for more than forty five years, performing a wide variety of music including jazz, pop, broadway & big band. He lived in LA for 2 years where he appeared as part of the Astrid Cowan Trio and also as a solo vocalist-guitatist throughout the beach cities of LA. Since 1984 he has made Grand Rapids his home and performs in and around West Michigan for concerts, special events and in night clubs. Rick is the featured vocalist in the Tom Hagen Trio and was part of their amazing 20 year stint in the lounge at Noto's Old World in Grand Rapids. He has toured to Seattle, San Francisco,

Long Beach and Houston as a featured artist at large corporate concerts. Rick's voice is often compared to those of Frank Sinatra, Michael Buble, Tony Bennett and Bobby Darin. He refers to this vocal catagory as "crooner swing". He is also a songwriter and has performed his one man show, featuring vocals and guitar, literally from California to Maine. Rick also takes a great deal of pleasure performing daytimes at senior communities. He has released six CDs, with another scheduled to come out early this spring. Rick also appears on a duet CD with vocalist Mary Rademacher and two other CDs by the Tom Hagen Trio. Over the years he has been a featured or co-featured artist at 12 Jazz Society concerts, 2 holiday parties and written the occasional review or article for WMJS Jazz Notes.

Mike Hyde

Guitarist Mike Hyde graduated from Ottawa Hills High School, Grand Rapids Junior (now Community) College and Aquinas College performing with the school jazz bands under the respective direction of Lynn Asper, Ray Gill, and Bruce Early. He went on to the Guitar Institute of Technology (Hollywood CA) to study jazz guitar under Howard Roberts, Joe Diorio, Ron Eschtete, Les Wise, Tommy Tedesco, and Dan Gilbert. Graduate studies in music and education followed at Western Michigan University and Grand Valley State College (now University).

Mike's teaching history includes positions at GRCC (classical guitar), Aquinas College (classical and jazz guitar), WMU (teaching assistant for guitar and music theory) and Hope College (contemporary and jazz guitar). He also maintained a substantial private studio of students over the years teaching all facets of guitar playing.

Since college, Mike has consistently been heard in various sized jazz groups with almost everybody on the local scene, most notably Bruce Early. He was also "hired guitar gun" for the Grand Rapids, Kalamazoo, West Michigan, and South Haven Symphony Orchestras. These performing experiences led Mike to share the stage with such national/international acts as Bob Hope, Neil Sedaka, Nancy Wilson, Denis DeBlasio, The Fifth Dimension, Randy Brecker, Three Mo Tenors, Jennifer Holliday, Tony Monaco, Bernadette Peters, Maria Schneider, Terri Lyne Carrington, and Stars of the Lawrence Welk Show to name a few. His current performances are primarily with his two jazz duos: Mike & Mike (with saxophonist Mike Frost), and Edye & Mike (with vocalist Edye Evans Hyde).


